

Maungatapere School

ENROLMENT SCHEME



The Board of Maungatapere School has adopted an enrolment scheme as instructed by the Ministry of Education. The enrolment of out of zone students is governed by the provisions of the Education Act 1989.

The enrolment scheme, which includes a precise description of the home zone, may be viewed at the school office or on the school website where copies of the scheme are also available.

Under this scheme, students will be enrolled if they live within the home zone described below.

Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone described below (and shown on the attached map) shall be entitled to enrol at the school.

Starting at the corner of State Highway 14 and Millington Road the zone travels North along Millington Road (properties on right excluded) until it reaches Golf Harbour View Drive. It then travels overland (80 Millington Road and 86A Millington Road excluded) North/North West to meet Kara Road North of Wood Road (all Wood Road properties included).

The zone travels south along Kara Road (properties on West excluded) until it reaches McKinley Road. It travels along McKinley Road (properties on North of McKinley Road excluded) until it reaches Kara Heights Road (properties on both sides of Kara Heights Road included). It then travels overland South/South West, crossing Kokopu Block Road at 364 Kokopu Block Road and 363 Kokopu Block Road (both included – properties to the North-West excluded) and continues overland to cross Mangakahia Road at 348 Mangakahia Road – 363 Mangakahia Road (both included – properties to the North excluded).

The zone continues overland, travelling South (all properties to the East included) to meet Whatatiri Road at the Woodward Road intersection (properties to the East included). It then continues overland south to cross SH14 at SH1988 included (properties to the west excluded) and SH2065 (properties to the west excluded).

The zone continues South/South East to meet Otuhi Road at 232 Otuhi Road (included in zone). It travels East across country until it reaches Snooks Road at the intersection with Wahakopu Road (all properties to the North included). It continues overland until it reaches Tavinor Road (properties to the North included), along Tavinor Road (both sides of the road included) until it reaches Otaika Valley Road, where it turns West and travels along Otaika Valley Road (both sides of the road in zone) to Cemetery Road. It then travels North along Cemetery Road (all properties the West are included) until it reaches 280 Cemetery Road where it travels overland (all properties to the south included) to reach SH14 at 737 SH14.

Proof of residence within the home zone may be required.

Out of zone enrolments

Each year the Board will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the

area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

| <u>First Priority</u> | this priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary. |
| <u>Second Priority</u> | must be given to applicants who are siblings of current students. |
| <u>Third Priority</u> | must be given to applicants who are siblings of former students. |
| <u>Fourth Priority</u> | must be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school. |
| <u>Fifth Priority</u> | must be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school. |
| <u>Sixth priority</u> | must be given to all other applicants. |

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, or fifth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by a ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued by the Secretary under Section 11G(1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.
