# **STAFF CHANGES**

While we have mentioned in our last newsletter changes to staff for 2020, we would like to make special mention of those leaving us:

Mr Scott Martin has been teaching in our Y3/4 area since coming as a long term reliever in Term 2 2013. This was his first position so he completed his 2 year provisional teaching mentor programme and was appointed to a permanent position at the start of 2015. We have obviously seen him grow in his role as a teacher and extend his knowledge and strengths. His passion for the environment, growing and planting is reflected in the development of our school gardens and work with Enviro Schools programme. Scott has been a great mentor to many students and a very positive part of our school staff. We will miss his humour and wish him well for his move north where he will have new challenges at Ahipara School next year. Mr Yaron Overeem has had a long connection with our school. From 2007-2009 he was based at Maungatapere as an ICT Lead Facilitator for a cluster of schools here and in Bream Bay. He worked in our school 1 day a week with staff to develop IT into the curriculum. After working at Ruakaka for a couple of years he returned to take up the deputy principal position in 2011. During the last 9 years he has had considerable impact on the Y7/8 programme, camps and activities and the high standards these students have achieved. As a senior leader he has also driven the IT in our school, continuing to provide professional development for staff and plan and implement the growth of digital equipment we have in our school. He has been acting principal for 2 terms and also received a sabbatical to look at the digital curriculum in 2018.

Yaron has many talents which he has shared with his students and the staff over the years. His abilities, support and input will be missed, but will serve him well in his new role as principal of Kokopu School.

It is a positive reflection on our school that we now have 2 local principals who were DPs here – Otaika Valley also.

### LEARNING SUPPORT COORDINATOR

We have appointed Mrs Andrena Norrish as our learning support coordinator. She will be working with a range of agencies including the MOE, RTLB, our school staff and families/whanau to provide learning support in many forms. Andrena has a wealth of experience and contacts so we are very lucky to have her. We would also like to acknowledge the great job she has done teaching our new entrant children for the last half of the year, so will be known to many of our new families.

### END YEAR TRIPS

Pool keys are now available and will be until 19 December. The pool will be open to the community from that day, but not until then as it will be covered overnight. # END OF YEAR INFORMATION AND ACTIVITIES

**Portfolio Reports:** These will go home on Wed 18 Dec. The end of year report is a condensed version of the half year report and does give you information about how your children are achieving in reading, writing and maths as well as other areas of the curriculum and the key competencies. Please enjoy reading and sharing the work in the portfolio with your children.

**Prize-giving:** Our final assembly and prize-giving is on the last day of school, Thur 19 Dec at 10am, and is held on our school field, weather permitting. All parents and whanau are invited. Pupils need to come to school as normal but **school finishes at the end of prize giving at around 11.15am**, so children need to be collected at that time. **There will be no end-of-school buses or after school care after prize-giving.** All pupils will be participating in some way and class and school awards will be given out. Parents are able to park on the school field but we will shut down cars coming onto the field from 9.45am to ensure the safety of everyone. You are welcome to bring something to sit on as it is an informal event.

If the weather is not okay we will use the Maunu School Hall. The decision relating to this will be made the day before. Please make sure your children have a good breakfast as they will not have morning tea and **do not** need to bring a school bag on the last day. If you are not attending our prize-giving please arrange for your children to be collected from school (or the Maunu School hall if wet). We expect prize-giving to finish by 11.15am. **2020 Classes:** On Wed 18 Dec all students will be given their 2020 classes and will visit their new rooms. It will give them a chance to meet their teacher and classmates. For some students this can create some anxiety, but we ask that you work through this with your children and be positive about the year ahead. We do consider placement very carefully and once they settle into their new classroom they are generally fine.

**School Grounds Use:** With the summer break approaching we ask the many local families that use our school facilities to please ensure that everyone including visitors are using them safely and taking care of them. This includes those using our pool, trampoline and fields. We do appreciate that no rubbish or graffiti is left and that our local families ensure that everyone takes responsibility.
